### Greetings all PW,

Here we are at the end of March and the ground is not white – even though according to folklore the month should be ending like a lion, hopefully we will not have a snowstorm; however, some rain would be good to wash away the dirt and add to the ground moisture. Easter is getting closer and that brings thoughts of daffodils and tulips along with the Easter Bunny and colorful eggs, so some rain along with warmer weather would be helpful in bringing out the colorful blossoms.



PW activities are scheduled to begin again in April. The two circles have been combined to form a Fellowship Circle and the first meeting for that group is scheduled for Thursday, April 7<sup>th</sup> at 9:30 AM in the church fellowship hall. The regular meeting for PW is scheduled for Thursday, April 21<sup>st</sup> at 2:00 PM in the fellowship hall so please mark these two events on your

calendar and plan to attend. Service Group B is in charge for the PW meeting. Meals on Wheels are being delivered this week so we are not scheduled again for this duty until May. Many thanks to all who participate in delivering these meals, and many thanks to Sharon Law for keeping this organized.

Grady Lundgren and his family continue to be in need of all your prayers; they have been very helpful so far as Grady is now at home continuing his recovery progress – YAY for Grady!!! Please also keep Carol Prenzlow and Elaine Gransee in your thoughts and prayers as they continue on the road to recovery as well as the Brevig family for support and encouragement; and as always prayers are needed for everyone in the military, law enforcement, public officials, health care workers and Christian leaders. Also, many prayers are needed for all involved in the Ukraine crisis; pray for an end to that conflict and that peace will once again reign in that country.

Easter is fast approaching, so here is some Easter trivia. The egg itself became a symbol of the Resurrection. Just as Jesus rose from the tomb, the egg symbolized new life emerging from the eggshell. In the Orthodox tradition, eggs are painted red to symbolize the blood that Jesus shed on the cross. The egg-coloring tradition has continued even in modern secular nations. Although eggs, in general, were a traditional symbol of fertility and rebirth, in Christianity, for the celebration of Eastertide, Easter eggs symbolize the empty tomb of Jesus, from which Jesus was resurrected.

You'd be forgiven for thinking that Easter eggs came from chickens. Forgiven, but still wrong. Easter eggs are actually the produce of the Easter bunny, a mythical creature who delivers eggs to children. The modern-day rabbit comes from the 17<sup>th</sup>-century folkloric *Osterhase*, a German egg-laying hare. AND, along the line of Easter candy, the modern chocolate Easter egg was first made by Cadbury's in 1875 two years after the first chocolate egg was conceived by J.S. Fry & Sons of England. (ALMOST EVERYBODY likes chocolate, right??)



Lent in Plain Sight: A Devotion Through Ten Objects by Jill J. Duffield

God is often at work through the ordinary: ordinary people, ordinary objects, ordinary grace. Through the ordinary, God communicates epiphanies, salvation, revelation, and reconciliation. It is through the mundane that we hear God's quiet voice. The book, Lent in Plain Sight, draws readers' attention to ten ordinary objects that Jesus would have encountered on his way to Jerusalem.

This year our church will use the season of Lent to facilitate conversation and connection to each other and the meaning of this time in the church year. The goal of this group study will be to focus on spiritual lessons and recognize how the seemingly ordinary can reveal the extraordinary presence of God in our lives.

#### Tuesday April 5 at 7pm- Sixth Week of Lent: Oil

We explore what the authors of Exodus, Psalm 23, Matthew, and James have to say about oil and its meaning in our lives today.

#### Tuesday April 12 at 7pm -Holy Week: Coats, Towels, Thorns, Stones

We will look at how coats, towels, thorns, and stones all play a role in Jesus' journey toward the cross this week.

Hello Rev. Amanda Boss!

This is Charlie Swartz. I served Kasson as pastor in the 90's. My wife and I have many happy and rich memories of our time with your congregation. Since then, I served in Bellevue Washington (a suburb of Seattle), and a have been serving in Avon Lake (a suburb of Cleveland, Ohio) these past ten years. I hope that your ministry is fruitful and giving you joy and meaning. This past summer I was diagnosed with a rare neurological disease called multi systems atrophy (MSA). I actually came to Mayo for a second opinion. It is a serious enough disease that I have been forced to go on disability, which

will start January 3. As I am relatively young (61) it is much sooner than expected to stop work. It would mean a lot to me if you could let the congregation know and ask for their prayers. Sincerely,

Grady is the son of Dana (Heser) Lundgren, the nephew of Andy and Casey Heser and Leah and Mark Ness and the grandson of Don and Jane Heser all from the K-M area. Gladiators!

Our church has been holding Jane and Don Heser's grandson, Grady Lundgren in prayer as he undergoes cancer treatment. The church Session donated \$1,100 out of the local mission fund (*loose offering moneys*) to help sup-
